Hazards

Hazard Poor weather conditions

Collisions leading to possible minor and major injuries and possible fatality. Risk Of Harm

Forward journey planning adopted. Existing Control Measures

Utilisation of weather reports from media.

Adequate time allowed for journeys taking into account weather conditions.

Journey suspended or rescheduled under severe weather conditions in extremes of weather.

Hazard Vehicle breakdown

Risk Of Harm Driver and passengers stranded roadside - exposed to weather and moving traffic.

Existing Control Measures Staff use their own vehicles and confirm they are subject to regular service contracts and are fit to be

driven.

Drivers will perform a POWDER (Petrol, Oil, Water, Damage, Electrics, Rubber) check prior to driving their

vehicle on company business.

Driver will contact roadside assistance to ensure vehicle is removed from the carriageway as soon as

possible.

Driver and passengers will wait in the safest place possible.

Warning triangle to be erected if safe to do so.

High visibility clothing is recommended to be worn by driver and passengers if leaving the vehicle.

Management team to be advised asap so alternative transport can be arranged for passengers if required.

Hazard Tiredness

Risk Of Harm Lapse of concentration and possible collision.

Existing Control Measures Drivers advised to take regular breaks from driving, as advised in the Highway Code (Rules for the Road).

Pre journey planning and use phone maps directions.

Overnight accommodation provided where journey distance and time on task make an excessively long

working day.

Hazard Impaired driving

Risk Of Harm Inattention leading to possible minor and major injuries and possible fatality.

Existing Control Measures Drivers will notify Management team of any medical condition that could impair their ability to drive.

Drivers are subject to all current Road Traffic Act (RTA) requirements.

Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs is not allowed.

Pre journey planning and use phone maps directions.

Mobiles not to be used while driving.

Hazard Incorrect loading of vehicle

Risk Of Harm Sprains or strains due to poor handling of luggage and unsecured loads not in the boot could contribute

to an accident.

Existing Control Measures Drivers to use correct manual handling techniques for loading or unloading vehicles.

All luggage will be placed in the boot of the vehicle during transit where possible. Luggage travelling in

the passenger cabin to be fastened securely.

Hazard Passenger restraints

Risk Of Harm Passenger injury during a collision.

Existing Control Measures Passengers must wear seatbelts in accordance with legal requirements.

Approved child booster seats and restraints must be height appropriate and securely fitted when

transporting passengers less than 12 years old or 135cm tall.

Hazard Speeding

Risk Of Harm Injury to passengers if collision occurs.

All drivers are subject to the Road Traffic Act (RTA) and are responsible for observing all applicable speed **Existing Control** 

limits in place. Measures

Hazard Vehicle security

Risk Of Harm Vehicle or contents stolen.

Drivers use their own vehicle and are familiar with the security controls and locking mechanisms. **Existing Control** 

Where possible, park vehicles in secure car parks or well-lit areas. Measures

Do not leave valuables and property in sight when the vehicle is left unattended.

Do not leave the vehicle keys within sight when vehicles are parked.

Hazard Licences

Risk Of Harm Inexperienced drivers are more susceptible to accident. Drivers will maintain their cars to a road worthy condition. **Existing Control** 

Drivers should be over 21 years old and have held a full licence for a minimum of 12 months before Measures

driving clients.

Drivers will provide the DVLA licence code for annual checks. However, they are still required to notify

Academic Families Ltd of any impediments to their license.

Drivers should not have any convictions for alcohol or drug related offences.

Drivers will confirm they are insured for occasional business use.

Hazard Driving abroad

Measures

Risk Of Harm Increased risk of incident due to unfamiliarity with local requirements. **Existing Control** 

Where possible, avoid driving and use local taxis or drivers.
