## External suppliers

Risk Of Harm Danger to children due to poor work practices and lack of competency.

Existing Control Measures Risk assessments and method statements are required from suppliers. These are checked and approved by

the Trip Leader and Managing Director.

Trip suppliers are required to have accreditation suitable for school trips and have public liability insurance in place (min £5m public liability) and to have provided a copy of the certificate prior to the trip.

# Roles and responsibilities

Risk Of Harm
Existing Control Measures

Inadequate supervision by support staff who do not understand their roles and responsibilities.

Trip Leader and Managing Director must approve the risk assessment prior to the trip.

Trip Leader to complete Trip Training courses.

First Aider to have current First Aid training.

Ratio of pupils to leaders for trips will be determined, on the basis of risk assessment; the activities to be undertaken, the age and maturity of the pupils and the onsite support/supervision available,

Before starting the trip, all leaders will be given a verbal briefing and trip handbook covering at least –

- The purpose, location, time and duration of the trip
- Itinerary and activities
- Composition of the group, including any individuals with special or particular needs, student and parent contacts.

- Transport arrangements
- Supervisory responsibilities throughout the visit, including any specific responsibilities eg First Aid, medication etc.
- Emergency procedures and communications, mobile phones,
- Contingency arrangements in the event of an accident or breakdown (including safety of the group, and planned means of onward travel or return home)

# Risk Of Harm

Existing Control Measures

## Pupil behaviour

Unruly pupils and those who do not stay with the group put the trip and other pupils at risk

Pupils known to be unruly may be excluded from a trip.

Unruly pupils to be closely supervised by a member of staff.

All pupils on the trip are given a specific briefing before the trip and immediately pre-departure.

Briefings cover issues including:

- Purpose, location, time and duration of visit.
- Activities to be included during the visit.
- Expected standards of behaviour.
- Code of Conduct and pertinent safety rules.
- Special clothing, protective requirements.
- Emergency procedures what to do if lost or separated from group, or there is an incident. WhatsApp contact groups established pre departure and used to communicate throughout the trip.

#### Travel

Risk Of Harm

Injury or missing pupil.

Existing Control Measures

Staff and pupils to wear their AF cap when travelling in busy areas so easily identifiable.

Emergency arrangements confirmed with everyone before departure.

Pupils to have working mobiles with Leaders' contacts.

Transport organised from approved suppliers and drivers.

Seatbelts must be worn by all passengers.

Hazard Infection

Risk Of Harm Covid requirements and riskier venues

Existing Control Measures Comply with all obligatory and best practice Covid and infection minimising requirements.

Regular hand washing especially before eating. Food and drink only consumed in designated areas

Hazard Medication

Risk Of Harm Illness caused by misuse

Existing Control Measures Parents must complete a medical form prior to each trip including details of any medications and whether

they are self administered or not.

One member of staff will be responsible for ensuring requirements are fulfilled.

Any child that requires medication must have a medication form with details from the trip medical form. Before administering medication, staff must consult the child's medication form to ensure they are clear on

the dosage to be given.

The medication form is updated as soon as medication is delivered to show date, time and dosage.

All medication must be stored safely as advised.

Hazard Inexperienced swimmers and Watersports

Risk Of Harm Greater risk than experienced swimmers and pose a risk to other swimmers, lifeguards and staff.

**Existing Control** Parents to complete swimming ability statement prior to acceptance on the trip.

Measures Inexperienced swimmers may not be accepted and if they are, may be closely supervised by the

designated lifesaver.

Our aim is to prevent incidents through supervision but swimming is only allowed where venue lifeguard

provision is available.

Watersports only allowed under venue supervision.
